Emily Beckner

Emily Beckner, violinist, identifies as both a passionate performer and educator, and currently studies at Oberlin Conservatory with Francesca dePasquale. Previous teachers include Todd Phillips and Anton Polezhayev, and she has studied with other renowned violinists over past summers, such as Sandy Yamamoto, Yoojin Jang, and Richard Amoroso.

Orchestral performance highlights include New York Youth Symphony's Grammy winning debut album, the Tribeca Film Festival, and CNN's Fourth of July Special in 2021. As a chamber musician, Emily recently performed at Oberlin's Hidden Valley Chamber Music Intensive. Alongside performing, Emily has her own private violin studio, which stemmed from her volunteer involvement for Musical Relief in 2020. Emily is also a teaching artist for Project: Music Heals Us and the secondary lesson program at Oberlin Conservatory.

I attended the festival from 2015 to 2017, and my favorite festival memory was having the opportunity to play first violin on my very first Beethoven quartet.

Drawing upon the breath and beat of flute and body, justine lee hooper exhales sentiments of past, present, and future by accessing defining nuances of human emotion. Performances by justine often invoke the vast interdisciplinary repertoire and legacy of black and gender-expansive creatives, using interpolation, improvisation, and electronics to pigment distinct perspectives of sound. An invitation is extended to listeners to self-reflect in the mirrors of comfort and discomfort.

justine is on the Jazz Committee of the National Flute Association, and they are an artist for CloudVocal wireless audio technology. They have performed for the United Nations and have been acknowledged by The New York Times, Playbill, and Rolling Stone. justine has collaborated with artists such as duendita, Joy Guidry, Key Glock, and Solange.

Roger Kalia

With a dynamic podium presence and noted passionate interpretations, Indian American conductor Roger Kalia has been celebrated by audiences and industry professionals alike. Kalia serves as Music Director of the Evansville Philharmonic, Symphony New Hampshire, and Orchestra Santa Monica. He is also Co-Founder and Music Director of the celebrated Lake George Music Festival in upstate New York.

The recipient of several awards from the Solti Foundation U.S., including an Elizabeth Buccheri Opera Residency with Lyric Opera of Chicago and five Career Assistance Awards, Kalia has appeared with the National Symphony Orchestra at the Kennedy Center, Chicago Sinfonietta, Louisiana Philharmonic, Szczecin Philharmonic (Poland), Hollywood Chamber Orchestra, Baltimore Chamber Orchestra, and the Long Beach Symphony, among many others.

A native of New York State, Kalia holds degrees from Indiana University, the University of Houston, and SUNY Potsdam's Crane School of Music.

She received distinction in the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM) Piano Level 4; outstanding in NYSSMA Piano Level 5; merit in ABRSM Music Theory Level 3; A- in NYSSMA Violin Level 5; distinction in ABRSM Violin Level 4; outstanding in NYSSMA Flute level 3; outstanding in NYSSMA Vocal Solo Level 3; Gold in the NYSSAM Ensemble Chorus Concert Performance. She was the Jericho District Music Award recipient.

She performed in the All-County Music Festival in 2023 (Violin) and 2024 (Vocal); and performed in the Long Island String Festival Association (LISFA) in 2023.

Nichole is an active member of the Metropolitan Youth Orchestra of New York (MYO) Nassau String Orchestra Violin and made her Carnegie Hall and Adelphi University debut at age 10; she participates in Jericho Middle School Concert Band, Jazz Band, and Chorus.

Scott Litroff

Renowned internationally for his seamless stylistic versatility, saxophonist DR. SCOTT LITROFF demonstrates his command of classical, jazz, and pop idioms through his extensive work as both a performer and educator. He has performed and served as guest artist/clinician throughout the United States and internationally at venues in Mexico, Taiwan, China, Thailand, and Japan. Dr. Litroff is Associate Professor of Jazz and Popular Music at Queensborough Community College at CUNY. His 2021 debut classical album, Global Saxophone, released by MSR Classics, was hailed by Classics Today as, "... intelligently curated, impeccably executed...appealing program that ought to attract more than just classical saxophone fans," and received a review score of 10/10. His Smooth Jazz single, "Never Forget," released in November 2023, was composed, produced, and mixed by the world-renowned Smooth Jazz producer and Billboard #1 chart topper, Darren Rahn. Dr. Litroff is the recipient of the prestigious 2013 Samuel Baron Prize, the 2012 Ackerman Prize



in Music, the 2011 Bob Meyers Award for Excellence in Jazz, first prize in Stony Brook University's undergraduate and graduate concerto competitions, and first prize in the Mannes College for Music Concerto Competition. He is also a two-time recipient of both the PSC-CUNY Research Award.

Scott Litroff attended the Festival in 2007.

Dr. Williams served as a visiting viola faculty member at the Eastman School of Music for the 2022-23 school year, and at the University of Tennessee Knoxville in Fall 2023. He currently teaches viola and chamber music at the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College, CUNY.

MEET THE FESTIVAL'S NEW ASSISTANT DIRECTOR - Douglas Aliano

Douglas Aliano is a native of Long Island, the youngest of five double bassists in his family, and a proud Pierrot Chamber Music Festival alum, winning the Festival's Concerto Competition in 2012. He recently completed work as a Double Bass Fellow with the New World Symphony in Miami Beach, FL. and has appeared with the New York Philharmonic, the Boston Symphony Orchestra, and the National Symphony Orchestra. His festival appearances include the Music Academy of the West, the Pacific Music Festival, Spoleto Festival, the Tanglewood Music Center, and the Verbier Festival in Switzerland. An active chamber musician and passionate advocate of new music, he has participated in numerous chamber music projects and has premiered many new chamber music and orchestral works. He also appeared as a member of Echo Chamber, an NYC-based ensemble dedicated to performing new works specially commissioned for its distinctive instrumentation. Douglas completed his undergraduate and graduate studies at The Juilliard School where he studied with Albert Laszlo and was a recipient of the Jerome L. Greene Fellowship. He recently received his master's degree in Music and Music Education from Columbia University and was a recipient of the Florence K. Geffen Scholarship.
